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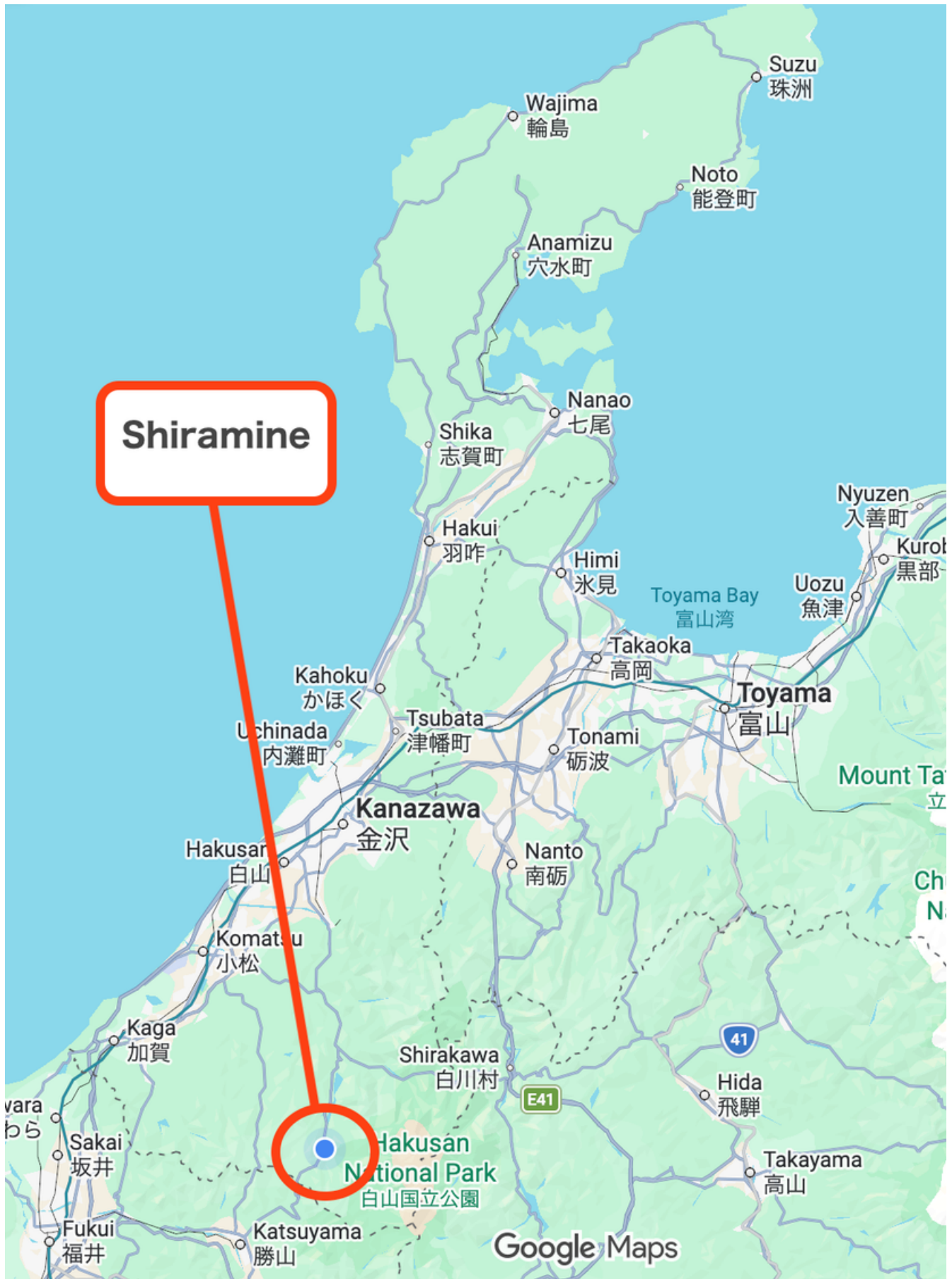

Where is Shiramine?



About Shiramine



Shiramine is a mountain village located on a new travel route connecting Kanazawa, Shirakawa-go, Takayama, and Fukui.

Surrounded by the rich nature of Mt. Hakusan and shaped by one of Japan's heaviest snowfall regions, it offers authentic experiences of traditional mountain life.

Visitors can stay in some restored kominka accommodations which are over 100 years old.

Local cuisine features Shiramine's famous firm tofu (kata-tofu), rare local grains, preserved foods, and the traditional Buddhist vegetarian cuisine served during Buddhist memorial ceremonies. Vegan, halal, and other dietary requests can also be accommodated. Shiramine is also home to a rare sodium bicarbonate hot spring, known for its skin-soothing waters. The tattoo-friendly hot spring facilities are especially popular with international visitors.

Educational programs linking Sustainability & Mountain Culture

Located within a UNESCO Global Geopark, UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, and Hakusan National Park, Shiramine offers programs focused on SDGs and sustainability.

Experience a traditional mountain culture of living in harmony with nature and making the most of local resources through traditional crafts, local food, and encounters with residents practicing sustainable lifestyles, including slash-and-burn farming and wasabi cultivation.

Strengths of Shiramine

We collaborate with universities on sustainability education and global talent development, using Hakusan National Park and UNESCO-designated areas as a living classroom.

Our educational programs, mainly for international students, have welcomed approximately 800 participants from universities including Kanazawa University, Tsukuba University, and UNU.

Programs range from 1-night stays to week-long experiences and form the foundation of our tour programs.

We can develop tailor-made experiences around diverse themes, including Hakusan mountain worship, traditional lifestyles, nature, sustainability, and mountain village culture.

Day 1: Deep Mountain Village

13:00 Meet at Kanazawa Station

You may also meet and finish the tour in Shiramine. The tour price is the same with or without transportation.

14:30 Hakusan Folk Museum

Exhibition and the traditional village, where six historic houses have been relocated.

Then, enjoy Japanese tea time in a traditional house with local specialties: Finger millet paste/ herbal tea

16:00 Check in at NIPPONIA Hakusan Shiramine

Free time after check-in. Relax at the hot spring, take a walk through the village, or simply enjoy a quiet afternoon.

Dinner – The Okuyamabito Table

Enjoy seasonal dishes prepared with the gifts of Mt. Hakusan, including river fish, firm tofu, locally sourced game, and other mountain specialties.



Day 2: A Day in the Life of a villager

6:45 【Optional】 Buddhist ritual

Join the morning prayers at a local temple in Shiramine.

8:00 Breakfast Restaurant You at NIPPONIA

9:00 Guided Village Walk

Walk through Shiramine's historic mountain village, designated as an Important Preservation District for Groups of Traditional Buildings. Discover the village's unique sericulture culture and the way people have lived with the mountains.

10:30 Hike to the Headwaters of Mt. Hakusan

Walk through the beautiful natural landscape along the Tedoru River. Enjoy fresh mountain air. (Routes vary depending on guest's fitness level.)



12:00 Lunch by a Hidden Mountain Spring

Enjoy a mountain picnic lunch and tea prepared with clear spring water from the mountains.

13:30 Return to accommodation
